In pursuing its mission to create opportunity, value ideas, enrich society, connect globally, empower people and embrace sustainability, NTU has earned a reputation for outstanding graduate employability, first-class learning and teaching facilities and standards, world-class excellence in research, being the most environmentally responsible university in the UK, impressive award-winning support services, and a diverse but close-knit student community.

Life at all Universities has changed due to the Coronavirus pandemic, and we continue to put the safety and wellbeing of our students and staff first. Throughout this time NTU has continued to strive to maintain the quality of teaching, support and experience our students have come to expect, whilst maintaining a strong and vibrant virtual community. Students can expect NTU to:

- treat students and colleagues equally and respectfully, in the spirit of equality and diversity, and creating an inclusive university community
- ensure a safe and secure environment, on campus and online, in accordance with Health and Safety standards and safeguarding responsibilities
- ensure all aspects of <u>sustainability</u> are considered in its teaching, operations and research as befitting one of the country's most sustainable universities
- safeguard all personal data provided, in compliance with the requirements of the General Data Protection Regulation and the Data Protection Act 2018.

The University aims to provide:

- a safe and productive learning community in which both staff and students will have the opportunity to develop their career ambitions and fulfil their potential
- an enhanced student experience through continual investment in our educational learning environment and resources
- excellent standards of teaching and assessment, support, advice and guidance for students and regular continuing professional development for its staff
- dedicated employability and enterprise staff to help students find and arrange <u>placements</u> and work experience to enhance employability in the global graduate market place
- a range of activities that will enhance employability and personal development including <u>work-based projects</u>; <u>volunteering</u>; <u>enterprise opportunities</u> and international or <u>language programmes</u>
- access to a range of services that support learning, engagement, progression and attainment
- high quality digital and learning resources
- effective communication to keep you informed about your course, services and university experience.

In addition, you can expect:

- course information which details, for example, key contacts, assessment criteria, teaching, directed learning, and mode of delivery
- clear deadlines for assignments and timeframes for feedback on submitted work
- to receive clear and constructive feedback to support your learning within three weeks, with the exception of final year dissertations and some project work
- regular opportunities to meet with your tutor (in person or online)
- an induction to help familiarise you with your learning environment, provide opportunities to talk to other students, and an introduction to your studies, available resources and key people
- to be provided, in advance of enrolment, with clear information on course tuition fees and any associated mandatory course costs, along with payment options and deadlines, and an indication of costs for optional items
- · varied opportunities to engage in providing feedback regarding your academic courses and services
- notice of changes to timetables in reasonable time through appropriate routes
- to receive information detailing assessment arrangements and regulations, academic guidance and support, and clear information on <u>academic appeals and complaints procedures</u>.

In return you are expected to:

- behave responsibly, particularly with regard to social distancing, treating staff and your fellow students with dignity and respect, and following the <u>Student Code of Behaviour</u>
- take responsibility for managing your own learning, participate in induction and tutorials, actively engage in your
 course and all timetabled and time bound sessions and activities including all tutorials, and actively respond to
 feedback received
- ensure that you submit assignments by agreed dates and that these are your own work
- tell the university about any barriers that impact on your learning including any absence, disability, health reason
 or exceptional circumstance which impacts your course
- provide feedback through <u>student academic representatives</u> and modular and course evaluations, which aim for improvements in the quality of learning and teaching
- provide constructive feedback to the Students' Union to help improve the overall student experience
- commit to the terms and conditions of being an NTU student and your obligations regarding fees and payments
- Respond in a timely way to communications from the university relating to enrolment, attendance, progression and graduation
- keep all your <u>contact details</u>, including your emergency contacts, up to date and disclose, any change to your personal situation that impacts on learning
- respect the physical and online environment of the University, including learning, social and living
 accommodation and behave respectfully towards our neighbours as a responsible and active member of the
 local community
- familiarise yourself and comply with the University's policies and regulations, including the <u>IS Computer Use</u> Regulations.

The Students' Union undertakes to:

- advocate for the best educational experience for you by enhancing the quality of teaching and learning, supporting educational transitions and embedding good practices for your future employment
- offer <u>representation</u>, <u>advice</u> and guidance to our members
- encourage healthy communities through <u>student groups</u>, which reduce isolation and encourage mutual respect between students and their communities
- represent and celebrate our diverse membership by leading the conversation on Equality, Diversity and Inclusion
- be <u>a well governed organisation</u> keeping <u>representation</u> and student led decision-making at the heart of all its activities whilst maintaining relationships with key stakeholders.
