Credibility interviews for tier 4 visa applications

What is a credibility interview?

Credibility interviews are a mandatory part of the tier 4 visa application process. During a credibility interview, students are interviewed to ensure that only genuine students are given permission to come to the UK to study. The answers you provide will influence the outcome of your visa application.

Where will the credibility interview take place?

If you make your visa application outside the UK, the interview will take place at the visa application centre at the same time as you provide your biometrics. You will receive an email giving you details If you make your visa application from within the UK, you will either receive a letter or an email with details of the interview and the place you need to attend, you may need to travel to another city.

Who will interview me?

The interviews are conducted by a member of UKVI staff, usually by video link / Skype. The interviews are always conducted in English. It is very important that you attend the interview at the appointed date / time. Failure to do so is likely to result in your visa application being refused.

What will I be asked about?

The International Student Support Service has put together some guidance to enable students to effectively prepare for the interview. You will need to carry out further research yourself and think about your personal situation. You will be required to provide specific and detailed answers. If you give incomplete or vague answers, the person doing the interview will not ask you further questions, so it is your responsibility to give as comprehensive an answer as you can to each question.

 Who will be responsible for paying your tuition fees and living expenses? How do they plan to finance them? Eg, through work / savings / other. 	 You need to provide suitable financial evidence as part of the visa application. You can find further information on our website: http://www4.ntu.ac.uk/student_services/document_uploads/11_9572.pdf You will also need to be prepared to provide further information about your income / your parent's income and other financial obligations, eg other dependent children at home / university etc.
 Where are you going to be living in Nottingham? How much will your accommodation fees be? Who will you live with? Will your accommodation be on or off campus?  Personal circumstances Do you have family in the UK? Are you bringing dependants to the UK with you 	UKVI will be looking to determine that your main purpose of coming to the UK is for your studies. If your main purpose is something else, eg to join family members in the UK, or for dependants to work etc, you should look for a more appropriate visa category.
